By the time you read this the fantastic Tallong Apple Festival will have come and gone, however I did want to put a note in to say that this is one of my favourite events on the calendar for our region each year. Huge congratulations must go to all the volunteers involved in making the day happen!

Update on Council issues

Throughout April discussion has centred on the Performing Arts Centre, and the management of the Aquatic Centre in Goulburn.

A working party is now being established to investigate the Performing Arts Centre; the McDermott Centre has been resolved as the preferred site option for the project. The working party will include representatives from local groups such as the Lieder Theatre, the Eisteddfod Society and Goulburn Conservatorium as well as Councillors and Community representatives.

If you are interested in becoming involved in the working party please contact Council on 4823 4444. Two local architects and two regional architects have been invited to prepare concept designs for the project and a joint decision is to be made between Council and the Performing Arts Centre Working Party.

The other major decision affecting our community was the Aquatic Centre Operations Review. Council resolved to resume daily operating and maintenance responsibilities at the Aquatic Centre from October 2016. This has come after extensive community consultation; the centre is an important community asset and we feel it is important for Council to again have direct involvement in management. With huge upgrades and extensions planned for the coming years during the redevelopment, I am very excited for the future of the Aquatic Centre!

Marulan Markets

These are turning into a fantastic monthly event – I've been to a few of them for a look myself and I was impressed. A quick reminder that they are on the second Saturday of each month; this month it falls on Saturday the 14th of May from 9am at the Memorial Hall.

Mobile Library

Membership and information drives have been held for 'The Big READ Bus' – which was in Marulan at the Brewer Centre on the 21st of April. The bus is a mobile library service funded by the Library Council of NSW and Goulburn Mulwaree Council – we are hoping the bus will be operational by July 2016. It will allow residents in Marulan to borrow books, magazines and much more.

Goulburn Art Gallery – The Art of Wool

This fantastic exhibition combines art from the permanent collections from the New England Regional Art Museum with fashions from the International Woolmark Prize archive. The focus is on the themes of Production, Romance, Pattern, Texture, Drape and Artistry. It's a great exhibition and I would encourage everyone to take the time to have a look; it closes on Saturday the 21st of May.

MARULAN VOLUNTEERS

Who are we? We are a group of local residents trying to improve the appearance of our town.

Why do we do this? If our town looks appealing and cared for, this will attract visitors who will support our local businesses. It also makes it a better environment for us to live in as locals.

What do we do? Local council mows the town's parks and some of its nature strips, but doesn't have the resources to do much more than this. The volunteers supplement the work of council by regularly cutting the edges and whipper snipping the main street and parks. We also weed the gardens in the parks, and collect litter in areas around town. Other less frequent and one-off activities have included: refurbishing the grounds at the Brewer Centre; mulching the gardens in Meridian Park; repairing and painting roadside fences in the main street; and repairing and painting the fence & rotunda in Tony Onions Park.

How often do we do it? Generally speaking, the volunteers work for 2-3 hours on the first and third Monday (starting approximately 9.30am) of each month.

The Big Apple has been Re-juiced...

In fact, Tallong's Big Apple has been rejuvenated and was a highlight at this year's Apple Day Festival with its fresh coat of paint. Our well-known landmark has been missing in action for a while... but no longer. Its glorious freshly-painted reappearance has given it a new lease of life.

For some years, the Big Apple stood majestically outside the Watling apple shed on Caoura Road, but since the death of Jim Watling it has been waiting for a new home. It has just spent the last while in the workshop of Tallong graphic and sign artist Alan Weston for a spray repaint.

The history of the Big Apple goes back to the 1970s when it was crafted in fibre glass by local artist Karl Zeschke as a tribute to Tallong's apple tradition, which dates back more than a century.

In 1917, the apple crop for Tallong alone was estimated at 10,000 cases! But the terrible 1965 bushfires devastated most of the orchards of the district. The Watling orchard was one of the few to survive and the Big Apple is testament to that.

ANZAC WWII veterans on parade...

At the ANZAC commemorative ceremony in Tallong, we were delighted to welcome so many descendants of World War II Tallong families who served with various Australian units in many theatres of war.

A highlight of the ceremony was the exhibition curated by local historian Janet Black that remembered the families. And there was much praise for the newly-dedicated war memorial and garden which has had a makeover with new plaques and stonework.



May brings in crisp cool days and bright autumn foliage on deciduous trees and shrubs to brighten up your day. The weather is still pleasant enough to work outside in the garden. Collect and recycle the fallen leaves to add to your compost bin or for rich mulch around the garden. Now is the time to plant trees, shrubs and climbers.

This is also the last chance to get bulbs and lilliums planted to ensure good growth and flowering in spring. Place your order for roses at your garden centre. Lemon trees are a treasure in any garden as the fruit is so versatile. They need plenty of sun but should not be exposed to drafts. Prepare the ground well before planting. Dahlias can be trimmed and left in the ground or lifted out with plenty of soil attached and stored over winter.

Keep up snail and slug bait and watch for aphids on young growth. They seem to like pansies. Gentle squash with your fingers or use soapy water. You can buy non-toxic sprays for this which are readily available.

Be prepared for frosts by providing shelter for those frost tender plants. At risk plants can be covered with a bit of shade cloth or even some newspaper for the smaller ones. This can be easily removed the next morning. Always leave frost-damaged growth on the plant until the end of winter. Then prune off to make way for spring growth.

Enjoy your autumn gardening.

Mini Brekkie Quiches

Mini Brekkie Quiches are packed with ham, fresh asparagus and tasty cheddar cheese. Great for an easy brekkie or for including in kids' lunches.

Ingredients:

1 cup flour
2 tablespoons butter
4-6 tablespoons ice water
6 eggs
½ cup ricotta cheese
½ cup ham
½ cup chopped asparagus
½ cup shredded cheddar

Method:

- Preheat oven to 150C
- Spray a 12 hole muffin tin with cooking spray.
- Combine the flour and butter until the butter breaks down into small pieces.
- When the butter is completely combined add one tablespoon ice cold water at a time as you keep combining until a smooth dough forms.
- Lightly press the dough into the muffin tin and up the sides.
- Whisk the eggs and ricotta until smooth, set aside.
- Add the chopped ham, asparagus and cheese to the muffin tins and pour egg mixture over until it is ¾ full.
- Bake for 20 minutes.

Southern Tablelands Rail Users' Group (STRUG)

After our meeting with Angus Taylor back in February where we agreed to send him our forward estimates for the electrification costs of the Sydney-Canberra line we have finally been able to deliver them to Angus. The delay was caused by a computer glitch which meant that a large portion had to be rewritten, which of course takes time when it is all voluntary.

While visiting Pru's electoral office to see if there was any news about a meeting with Andrew Constance we were told that Pru has a meeting with Rob Mason scheduled. She pushed for STRUG representatives to be present but the Transport Minister wants her to meet Mason alone. I stressed that Pru should get all the reasons for Mason saying our timetable would not work. The Ministers office said they could organise a meeting after Pru meets Mason.

We have received correspondence from Jai Rowell's office with a letter from Constance in regard to Jai's representations over electrification. Constance advised that the ARTC would have to pay for it. The Transport Minister addressed a meeting of would be contractors in Sydney last week and significantly the journalist reported that there was no budget or plans for presentation to the would be contractors.

Digging into Marulan's History at Holcim – contributed by James Caulfield, Goulburn High School

In March 2016 I was fortunate enough to spend a week working alongside the community and environment team at Holcim's Lynwood Quarry. For a year 10 student from Goulburn High with a huge interest in history, this was a dream work experience placement.

For five days I got to see how the company manages and preserves the artefacts found on the quarry site. I gained hands-on experience with artefacts – from cups and plates to old padlocks and coins.

I was encouraged to put forward my own ideas about the company's heritage management strategies. Two of my suggestions were accepted and I spent the remainder of the week working on the development of a public-friendly online catalogue and developing information cards for display items.

The team at Holcim was friendly and made me feel very welcome. I never felt as though I was a burden on their time, and everyone was always willing to answer my questions or help out when my supervisor was unavailable. Even better, at the conclusion of my placement, I was invited to come back and participate in future history activities later this year. Right now, I'd rate the week at Lynwood as one of my best school experiences, and it has only reinforced my desire to work as a historian.

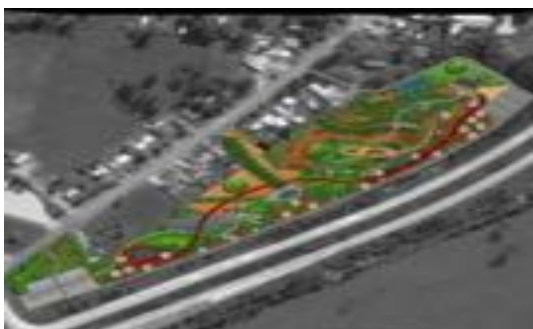

2016 looks to be an exciting year for HASP and the development of the Regional Heritage trail from Tallong, through Marulan, Bungonia, Towrang and into Goulburn.

We have a concept plan for the development of the parklands adjacent to the Hume Highway at Marulan. A very big thank you to Chris and Ben, graduates from Canberra University for their work on the landscaping of the park. We couldn't have gotten to this point without their involvement.



This will be on display at the Tallong Apple day Festival on the 1st May so come and visit and see what is planned.

Initial estimates for the first stage of the earthworks are being sorted with an aim to then seek the funding both in kind and dollars through various avenues.

A committed sub committee of HASP are developing a number of fundraising ideas to raise awareness and support the development of the project. Watch this space for some upcoming events.

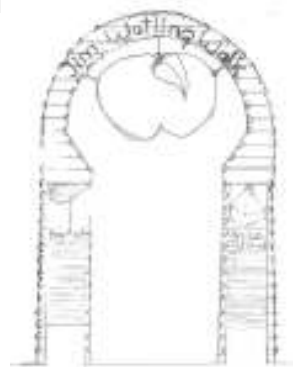

Work continues in the villages with a focus on community and heritage to encourage travellers to follow the trail.

Bungonia, are continuing their planning on erosion control works in Woodward's creek and the building of a Columbarium and

Memorial wall for Bungonia's Historic Cemetery. The memorial wall will capture the names of the approximately 200 people in this historic cemetery whose details are not recorded as well as the convicts and First Fleeters that are in the cemetery.

Tallong are moving ahead with the development of the Memorial Park with additional car parking and rehabilitation works of the woodland to the east. The Big Apple has also been removed for some much loved TLC and will reappear in the new future as a gateway feature to the Memorial park.



An upgrade of the war memorial is also planned.

Meanwhile activity continues on the repair and restoration of the Towrang Stockade. The Trust responsible for the care of the stockade have been granted funding for the completion of the restoration of culverts 5 and 6 with further funding granted this year for the repair of Culvert 1.

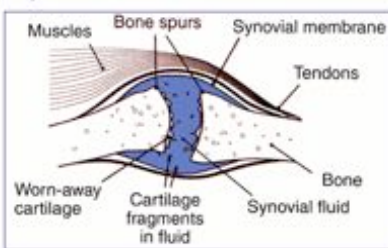

Joint Health



As with our joints, our pets' joints begin to creak and crackle with time and misuse. Stiffness, pain and immobility may result from the development of bony arthritis, also called osteoarthritis or degenerative joint disease. Recognizing and treating this disease will have a profound effect on your pets' quality of life.

A joint with Osteoarthritis



The development of osteoarthritis depends upon many factors. Joints naturally wear down with age, but factors including injuries, poor nutrition, obesity and inactivity accelerate these processes. These factors increase joint surface erosion, alter the lubricating fluids and compromise the tissues that stabilize the joint. As stability diminishes, the bones respond by creating spurs and bridges. This results in arthritis and a painful, inflamed joint.

Behavioral changes are generally the earliest indicator of pain and discomfort associated with osteoarthritis. If we wait until our animal is limping or unable to stand, we have already missed many of the warning signs, which include:

- Stiffness, especially after resting and in the morning/in colder weather
- Aggression especially when being lifted
- Toileting accidents
- Decreased grooming
- Increased licking, esp joints
- Decreased jumping, playing or climbing behaviours
- Stretching more after rising
- Increased anxiety or 'clinginess'
- Overall reduction in activity
- Reluctance to use stairs
- Birds may feather pick
- Increased vocalization especially when being handled
- Weight/muscle loss
- Difficulty eating
- Joint swelling/heat
- Increased joint size

Many of these signs can be caused by other diseases, which is why it is important to have your animal examined by a veterinarian. Depending on this examination, further testing may be required in order to rule out serious diseases such as heart failure or bone cancer.

The focus of treatment of arthritis falls into three categories: **pain relief, control of inflammation and improvement of joint health**. Initial treatment options may involve weekly injections, anti-inflammatory medications which are prescribed by your veterinarian, nutraceuticals and physical therapy. A "maintenance" plan using supplements and physical therapy for joint health may also be instituted. The optimal plan is tailored specifically for you and your individual pet.

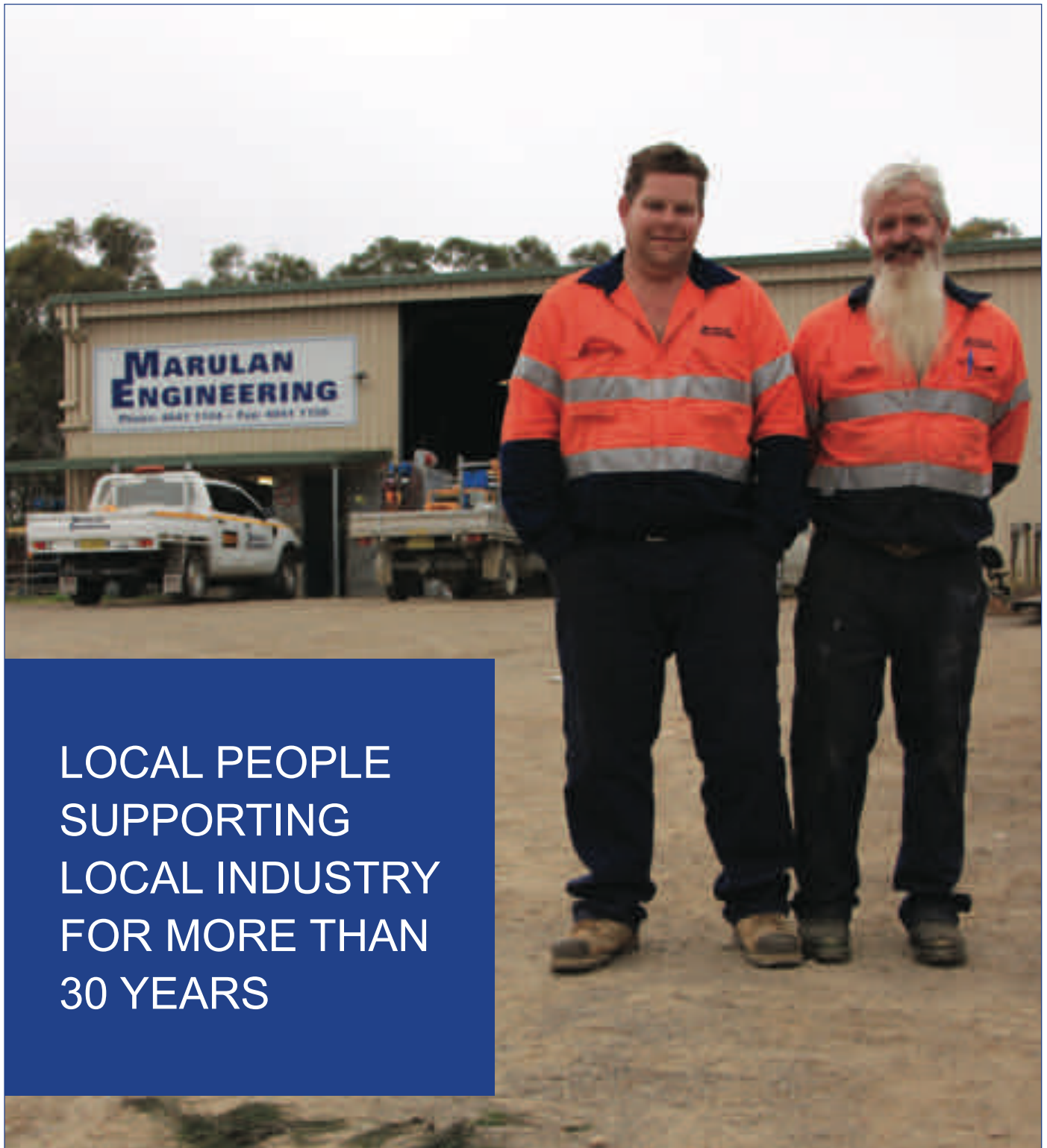
