Local Government Reform

As I write this we are only a week away from putting in our final submission to the delegate John Rayner in regards to Local Government Reform and the Minister's proposed merger between Goulburn Mulwaree & part of Palerang council.

Over the last month Warwick Bennett, myself and our councillors have held countless meetings with our neighbouring councils and our local MP's, attended the Public Inquiries and consulted with the community. On top of this work Community Plus also surveyed well over 2000 residents from Goulburn Mulwaree & Palerang, and we have a good feel for the opinions of our residents.

I can assure residents that as a council we will be strongly opposing the Minister's Proposal, and arguing that it does not make us a 'fit for the future' local government area. A date has been set for the opening of the Marulan Archive Resource Centre: Sunday 29th May 2016. The building has been completed and it looks great thanks to a working bee of around 20 members and friends. It has been a big effort which has certainly paid off.

In History (reprinted from times gone by)

On 6th March, 1951 a meeting was held in the Marulan School of Arts Hall with the purpose of forming a branch of the Country Women's Association.. Sixteen ladies attended and Mtrs Burton was elected President.

They purchased a block of land with a garage on it in 1953 and in 1964 when the Branch won an award and five hundred pounds (\$1,000) cash they decided to build their own permanent rooms.

With the full co-operation of their "men folk " and lots of hard work the rooms were officially opened on 17th February, 1968 – forty eight years ago this week. Mrs. Narelle Thompson who presently resides in Marulan was Honorary Secretary at that time said she distinctly remembers this important event in Marulan's history and also recalls that Mr Ron Brewer presented a picture of Her Majesty the Queen to be hung in the new CWA rooms.- I understand it still adorns this wall.

Other Marulan residents that were present at the ceremony on 17th February, 1968 were Marie Pender, Alice Vespignani and Bea Berrisford.

Since its inception the Marulan Branch of CWA has gone from strength to strength and today is a vital part of our community with a membership of over twenty members.

Local News



School Visit to Quarries

On Tuesday 24th November 2015, students from Goulburn High School, Mulwaree High School and Trinity Catholic College travelled to Marulan to get the lowdown on Boral's Peppertree and Holcim's Lynwood quarries.

First stop was Boral's Peppertree Quarry. We were welcomed by staff and given a briefing on the rigorous safety standards required in this challenging environment. We were taken on a tour of the site, and we saw first-hand the cutting edge innovations used at the quarry. There was an amazing array of plant and equipment—dozers, trucks, excavators, hoppers, conveyer belts and crushers. The various functions of each piece of machinery were explained by our guides. During the tour, we were taken right to the edge of the pit where the resources are extracted and processed 24 hours a day, 7 days per week. It was “ore”some!!



Peppertree produces granodiorite which is mostly used as road base material. It was interesting to see the wide variety of jobs undertaken at the quarry—everything from operating the massive machinery right through to the monitoring of safety of the site through technology back in the offices. It was also really valuable to hear from each of the guides about their career journeys and how they got to their current jobs.

We dusted off the day with a visit to Holcim's Lynwood Quarry where we learnt about the considerable career opportunities available in the mining industry and about the wide variety of skills that are required to run the industry. We had a blast!

On behalf of Trinity Catholic College, Mulwaree High School and Goulburn High School we would like to thank Holcim and Boral for providing us with such a valuable opportunity and for the lovely morning tea's. Thank you also to Goulburn Mulwaree Council and the Extractive Industries Working Group for organising the bus.

A display highlighting the activities of those Tallong residents who served in WW11 is being planned. And a big plea to local residents for information about or photographs of any of those Tallong servicemen and women. In particular, Janet would like to contact any members of the Burrows family who lived at 'Wyadra' on the Old Wingello Road, Tallong. Four members of the family served and one was killed in action in Malaya in early 1942.

This is a photo of one well known local identity, Bill Charles or more correctly Private William Herbert Charles, Service No N267137. He enlisted on 9th Sept 1941 and served in the 2nd Australian Army Trades Training Depot. On discharge in 1945, he had been promoted to the rank of Lance Corporal.

Bill was born and raised on an orchard called 'Rock Lily' on Caoura Rd. After the War, he returned to orcharding, married and built a second house on the property known as 'Blue Haven'. After the 1965 fires destroyed the orchard, he raised cattle as well as driving a bull-dozer. He was the long-term Captain of Tallong RFS.

Joan Downie was his niece and Win Onslow his sister.

She'll Be Apples on May Day

As we move from summer to autumn, the days shorten and the temperatures become a little cooler. It is much nicer in the garden and you can visit your local nursery to buy something for the garden without fearing that it might die in the heat.

You can now give the lawns a boost with a dose of lawn food. Hopefully there will be some rain around to water it in. If not use the hose. Fuchsias and geraniums can be pruned and cuttings taken. Prune just below a joint, trim most of the leaves off, dip in honey and put in a pot of good potting mix and water. The cuttings should only be 8 to 10cm long. With the cooler weather you can get your winter vegie garden planted. Also plant up your flower beds with pansies, lobelia, marigold etc and also put in bulbs for spring flowering.

Keep a watch out for garden pests. Snails and slugs are active on damp dewy evenings. Protect young seedlings and bulbs with a barrier of sawdust or crushed eggshells. A caffeine spray made with strong espresso coffee is an effective and environmentally method of control. Snails find coffee unpalatable and also die when they come in contact with it. High levels of caffeine can damage some plants. But using leftover coffee from your coffee maker on or around plants should keep snails and slugs at bay.

Last month we posted a Summer Veggie Salad recipe so we thought we'd go for a bit of fish this time 'round. Have a go at this simple Grilled Fish recipe with Cherry Tomatoes & Capers.

Ingredients:

2 thick pieces fish	¼ cup olive oil
1 red onion	1 punnet cherry toms
1 tablespoon capers	1 lemon
2 cloves garlic	¼ cup parsley

Method:

1. Drizzle the fish with olive oil, salt & pepper. Grill on the bbq or in a fry pan. Set aside.
2. Saute the garlic, onions, cherry tomatoes and capers till golden.
3. Plate up the fish, topped with the tomatoes & capers. Drizzle with lemon juice and olive oil. Sprinkle with salt & pepper and chopped parsley.

This makes such a lovely light lunch and is especially great with a glass of something bubbly.... Whatever that might be.

Regional News



Southern Tablelands Rail Users' Group (STRUG)

STRUG held its first meeting for 2016 on Monday 1st February. We had a reasonably good attendance although a number of regulars forgot the date. Members were informed that STRUG has secured a meeting with John Barilaro on the 22nd of February. The committee would like to take our form letter campaign to neighbouring electorates so that it is not only Goulburn residents asking for this project. Members were asked to give their preferences for the type of meeting (short or longer form).

In early February a meeting was secured with Angus Taylor, Member for Hume. STRUG met with Angus on the 15th to discuss his possible support for the electrification campaign. Angus reaffirmed that he is unable to have any influence on the timetabling issues but was reasonably interested in the electrification issue. Towards the end of the meeting he asked if we had any provisional estimates that we had done and we agreed to forward this document to him. We were very pleased with our meeting with him and his appointment to the Cities portfolio may be a benefit to our campaign.

We are seeking another follow up meeting with Andrew Constance after our September 2015 meeting. At that meeting Andrew tasked Rob Mason, CEO of TrainLink with verifying the timetable that STRUG presented them and said that he wanted us back for another meeting. We think it is time.

We hope to reaffirm John Barilaro's position re electrification and what action he proposes to take in support of our campaign when we meet him on the 22nd.

Who are we? We are a group of local residents trying to improve the appearance of our town.

Why do we do this? If our town looks appealing and cared for, this will attract visitors who will support our local businesses. It also makes it a better environment for us to live in as locals.

What do we do? Local council mows the town's parks and some of its nature strips, but doesn't have the resources to do much more than this. The volunteers supplement the work of council by regularly cutting the edges and whipper snipping the main street and parks. We also weed the gardens in the parks, and collect litter in areas around town. Boral Marulan South Operations Newsletter



February 2016

Boral's Marulan South Operations are pleased to present our regular newsletter for the information of our valued neighbours and wider community.

2016

Christmas and the holidays have come and gone and both sites are now back in full production for 2016.

The Peppertree Quarry and Marulan South Limestone teams took advantage of the break and carried out major maintenance on the rail line and key equipment, with a number of local contractors working alongside staff over the break.

Planning

Peppertree is in the process of submitting a modification to the quarry's current planning approval, seeking an extension of the area for overburden and extending 'in pit' operating hours.

The modification and supporting reports will soon be submitted to the NSW Department of Planning and Environment and are expected to be on public exhibition for comment some time in March.

The Marulan South Limestone development application continues to be prepared for submission later this year.

Safety

The end of 2015 saw a couple of big months with a heightened focus on safety.

Both sites held 'Stop for Safety' interventions to ensure a focus on improving the safety of our teams working onsite. We want to make sure everyone goes home in the condition they come to work in.

Peppertree's 'stop' was focused on housekeeping. The site's maintenance team and our contractors spent the day talking through housekeeping issues and then spent the afternoon cleaning designated areas. All collected materials were stockpiled, sending a clear message about what we leave lying around when a job is finished. Different initiatives have now been put in place as learnings from this day.

Marulan South Limestone held a 'safety intervention', with over 70 managers from across the Australian Cement business inspecting the site and talking with the teams about safety practices.

New refresher inductions have now been held so that we have all started 2016 with a focus to make sure we all go home the way we came to work.

Boral Sales team visit

The Quarries Sales team have visited Peppertree to better understand how our products are produced, therefore becoming better able to answer customer queries.

The team were impressed with the scale of the site, the automated train loading capabilities and the volumes of production being achieved by our small number of people.



Outward Bound 2016

The Boral youth leadership program with our partner, Outward Bound, kicked off with a pre-program get together of participants and their parents at Peppertree during February.

A total of 26 students from Goulburn, Mulwaree, Moss Vale and Bowral High Schools have accepted the challenge to spend a week in the bush, working as a team to conquer a number of personal and physical challenges. Before setting off they experienced an evening with their parents at the quarry to understand what the program will mean. We wish them all the best for the week away with the Outward Bound instructors and Boral mentors, and look forward to the tales.

The Travelling Gourmet



Being a gourmet traveller has its draw backs especially if you are on an assignment to specifically test one and one only taste sensation.

It is disconcerting sometimes to sit and read a menu: fried tofu on a bed of rocket with a side dish of garlic infused kale pan fried or corn fed chicken smoked with local hickory chips then pan fried in truffle infused local olive oil with side serve of Dutch cream chips sprinkled with Murray river pink salt.

I know it takes great persuasive powers on my behalf to keep my wife on track and on task to select and judge the best hamburgers. So as I stated last time, we are travelling to Bungendore. This is about the radius we have set ourselves. Further than that we are fearful that sudden onset of seniors dementia might not allow us to find our way home. However I take great solace in the fact we both still have our licenses and if we were found meandering some country road west of Bungendore at least the people that rescue us will be able to return us to our address. Also we always take a bottle of frozen water; it's from our tank at home and tastes better than town or city water, so dehydration will not be a problem if the worst occurs.

We set out mid morning planning to arrive by noon. We spend an hour exploring Bungendore's main street sussing out potential places to start the judging.

This is probably the hardest part: how to select the establishment you will grace with your patronage. There are a few tips these days with sidewalk dining. It is not too hard at about 12.30 to spy on what people are eating outside; a quick judgment can be made about suitability. On inclement days it can be a tad tricky entering an establishment wandering around the tables looking as if you are going to perch somewhere and then because it doesn't meet expectation make a beeline for the front door and exit. Some proprietors become agitated, insulted and occasionally downright insulting. The good thing about being a travelling gourmet: you wont be back there again to be recognised.

We have narrowed the selection down to two eateries. We have a pow wow on the footpath. The selection needs to be a democratic choice; equal voting rights et cetera. Having been married for a long time, I am smart enough to know I will like my wife's selection.

After we sit at the eatery my wife has selected, we open the menus and are immediately faced with a dilemma: hamburgers are regional. Just as in France you have wine regions such as Burgundy and Champagne, it appears this regional distinction has reached the hamburger world too. Staring at us from the menu is "open hamburger with chips". The complication here is how we are going to compare apples with apples. A quick decision is made: we reunite the open bun with its other half and eureka! We have a hamburger! If we were by the sea, we could have fed the chips to the sea gulls but I stated to my wife that I would make the supreme sacrifice and eat all the chips and discount them from my assessment of the hamburger. I do not know if she was all that happy with my sacrifice when the hamburgers arrived and I shovelled all the chips off her plate. The look I received was not a loving one.

In front of us is the burger. Time to taste and dissect. My disappointment immediately shows. The meat patty is smaller than the one from Taralga. Biting into it I detect an overuse of filler. Pretty good beetroot, tomato and lettuce, good sauce, an egg which is a bonus, but sitting on top of the burger (shock horror!) the bun is denude of sesame seeds! My wife and I look up at the same time and shake our heads. It's too soon into our search for the best, most memorable burger to start allotting marks. We decide to wait until after our next excursion so that we have a comparison of three burgers. That will be when we will mark each burger out of 10.

So we rise from the table reasonably sure of our way home. At the car we both say "Crookwell".

SPECIFIC CANINE & FELINE VACCINATIONS

Previously, we discussed whether to vaccinate, and how often. Now we'll go through available vaccinations, the diseases they produce, and whether a particular vaccination is right for you and your pet.

Dog Core Vaccination: "C3", "The Parvo needle", "Distemper needle"

- Canine Parvovirus: This virus is highly contagious, lasts a long time in the environment and is incredibly tough and difficult to kill. It causes very severe vomiting and watery, bloody diarrhoea. Dogs may and often do die due to dehydration and shock. Vaccination is vital for all animals and is very protective.
- Canine Distemper: This virus is highly contagious. It affects many organs, leading to seizures, paralysis and/or death. There is no proven reliable treatment for this disease. Vaccination is very protective. Ferrets are also vulnerable and can be vaccinated against Distemper.
- Canine Adenovirus-2: This virus is highly contagious and causes a form of hepatitis.



Cat Core Vaccination: "F3", "Cat Flu needle"

- Feline Panleukopenia Virus: Also known as "Kitty Parvo", this virus shares most of the same traits as Canine Parvo, causing vomiting and diarrhoea. Vaccination is very protective.
- Feline Herpesvirus: This virus is highly contagious and if contracted remains present in the cat's body for all for their life causing flare ups particularly in times of stress. It causes watery eyes, "cat flu" and corneal ulcers. Vaccination is protective but pre-existing infection is common.
- Feline Calicivirus: This virus is highly contagious and causes "cat flu", and mouth ulcers. Vaccination is protective, however a new highly-virulent strain has been appeared in some areas.



Non-Core Dog Vaccinations:

- Kennel Cough (KC, part of C5): Protects against 2 causes of "Kennel Cough" – Parainfluenza virus and Bordetella bacteria. This virus and bacteria are very contagious and cause the worst disease. Protection is effective, but does not prevent disease from other bacteria or different strains of the virus. It is strongly recommended for dogs that socialize with other dogs and most kennels will require this vaccination.
- Lepto/Corona (C2i): Lepto is a contagious bacteria found in soil or standing water contaminated with rodent urine or pig urine. Infection causes bloody diarrhoea, vomiting and severe kidney failure. It is recommended for dogs who are potentially exposed and for Piggers. Coronavirus vaccination may protect against a mild viral diarrhoea particularly in puppies.

Non-Core Cat Vaccinations:

- Chlamydia: Effective protection against a specific Chlamydia in cats that causes a very "gunky" form of cat flu with severe conjunctivitis. Cats that frequently mingle with strange cats may benefit from this vaccination.
- Feline Leukaemia Virus: This virus causes leukaemia. Most adult cats defeat the virus, but kittens and immunocompromised cats are at risk. It is most commonly spread through saliva during grooming. Kittens that socialize at a young age or in a foster home benefit from this vaccination.
- Feline Immunodeficiency Virus: This virus causes "Kitty AIDS". Transmission is usually through bite wounds. The vaccine is mostly protective and documentation of vaccination is very important due to testing procedures. Outdoor cats may benefit from this vaccination.

It is important to remember that no vaccine is 100% effective; science simply has not come this far! However, by selecting the vaccines that are best for your pet and family, we can effectively protect your furry friends from these diseases. 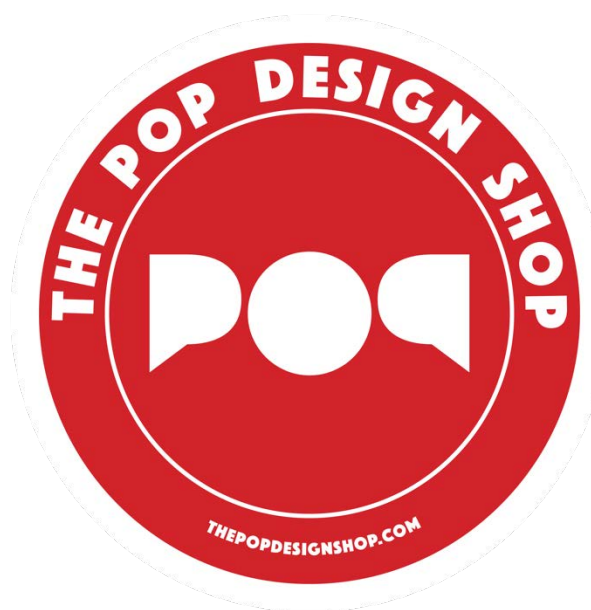
