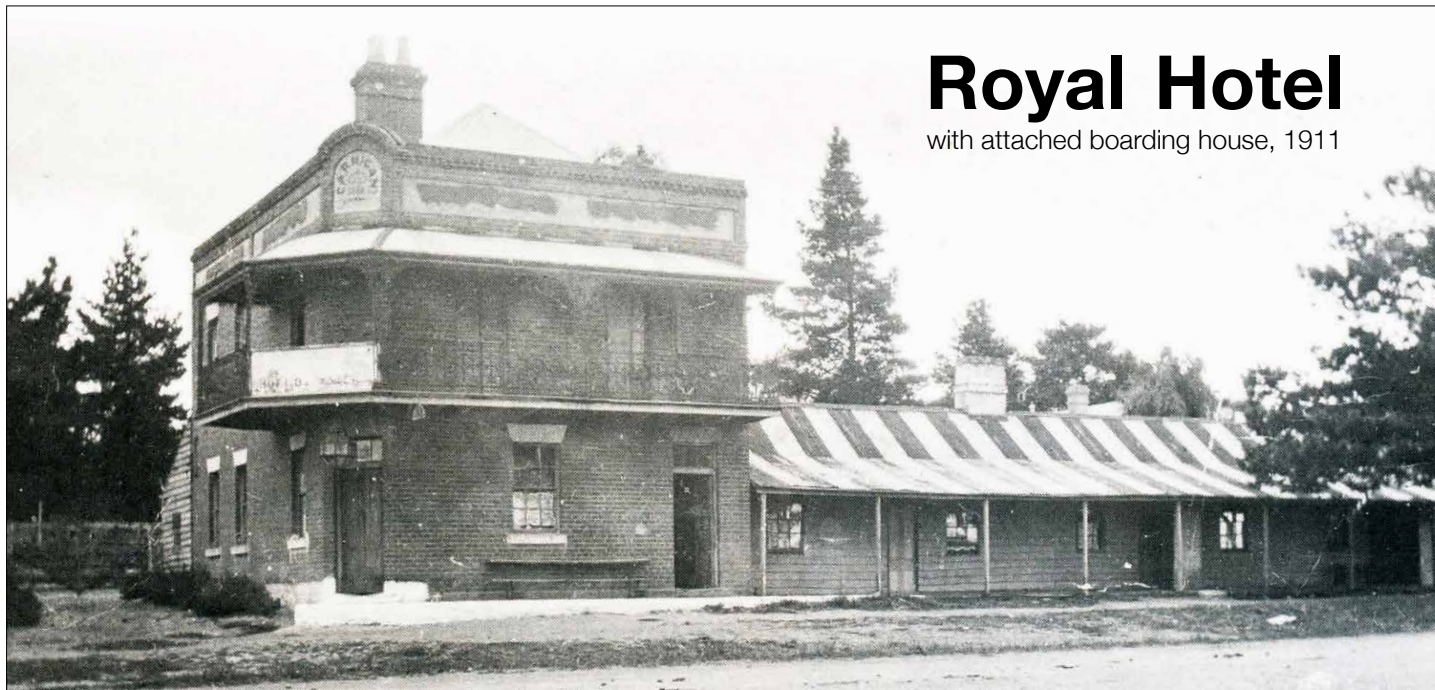

The Royal Hotel was built in 1872 by Mary Carrigan. Mary Carrigan's two deceased former husbands had owned The Whitehorse Inn at Wingello and the Duke of Edinburgh Hotel at Marulan.

After Edward Carrigan died in 1871, his wife Mary Carrigan purchased land opposite the Terminus Hotel and built the Royal Hotel the same year. The two-storey brick section at the front of the building was completed in 1880 and the original wooden section at the back became a billiard room. The new Royal was by far the most opulent of all the inns in the town with plush velvet curtains and beautiful furnishings.



In 1884 Mary Carrigan died, followed a few weeks later by her daughter Mary Hourn. The eldest daughter, Annie Kelly and her husband then took charge of the hotel.

At about the turn of the century, all hotel licences were recalled by the Government and the Royal Hotel was not re-issued with a licence. Since then, the building has had many varied uses, including as a boarding house, a shop, and as a private residence.

2017/18 Budget Preview

In April, we will be considering the draft budget for 2017/18 at a council meeting for the first time. Following this we will be placing the 2017/18 budget and the 4-year delivery program on exhibition for community consultation; an important part of the process. For April, I would like to focus on some of the projects included in these documents for Marulan and the rural parts of Goulburn Mulwaree:

- Waste Water Treatment Plant – these capital works include the design and completion of the Marulan Waste Water Treatment Plant over the coming four years.
- Solar Farm – We will be investigating the installation of a floating solar farm on our Marulan raw water storage. If this project is feasible we will be working towards funding for the project in 2019/20.
- Towrang Bridge – \$3 million is allocated in the 2019/20 Financial Year for the replacement of the Towrang Bridge. This will mean a two lane, far improved flood resistant structure for residents of Towrang Road.
- Rural Roads – Over \$18 million is allocated within the 4-year delivery program for rural road construction, rehabilitation, resealing and widening. Specific details of these works for 2017/18 will be available in the Operational Plan; however, some of the roads we are focusing on in the Marulan region include Carrick Road, Brayton Road and Tallong Park Estate.
- Waste Management Centre improvements – \$125,000 is included in 2017/18 for Waste Management Centre improvements at Marulan. This will include environmental works as well as significant upgrades for the public areas of the centre.
- Water Treatment Plant upgrade feasibility study – Included in the 4-year delivery program is a feasibility study for the upgrade of Marulan's Water Treatment Plant.

We are also moving forward with a number of exciting projects for Goulburn Mulwaree that have been well publicised including the Performing Arts Centre, upgrades to the Aquatic Centre, a skate park upgrade, sporting field improvements and much more!

Please do take the chance to have your say on the budget and delivery program in April – all feedback will be carefully considered by Council and staff, and will play a major role in the shaping of our 2017/18 budget and the 4-year delivery program.



As reported last month we had a visit to our Chamber's March meeting by NBN executives. We were informed that the development application (DA) for the fixed wireless tower has been submitted to Goulburn Mulwaree Council and given normal events, it should be operational early 2018 (estimated around January or February). This will be a great thing for Marulan both for businesses and residents, as speed and reliability will be greatly enhanced.

The first meeting of the Kite Festival took place last month. Sharon Makin, Environment & Stakeholder Advisor, Boral, who will be coordinating this year's event invited community groups to the first meeting. Some great ideas came out of the meeting for this year's festival and a formula for sharing of the proceeds of the festival amongst all community groups who take part in this year's festival. This formula will be nussed out, so that all groups know what they will be working for. This year, improvements to the Hall by way of extra seating both inside and out have benefited from Kite Festival profits.

People living on Jerrara Road will have noticed the trees along its length, on both sides have been culled. This is in preparation for the widening of the road by Multiquip Pty Ltd for trucks from Ardmore Park, Bungonia. This is a state significant development, and so is controlled by the State Government. The residents would hope that the narrow bridges will also be widened. If you need further information please look at the Department of Planning's website which documents the conditions for the development.

The Chamber's next meeting will be held on Thursday 20th April commencing at 6.00 pm at the Marulan Memorial Hall.

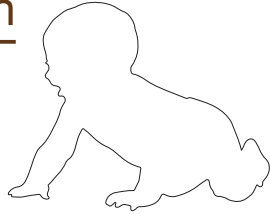

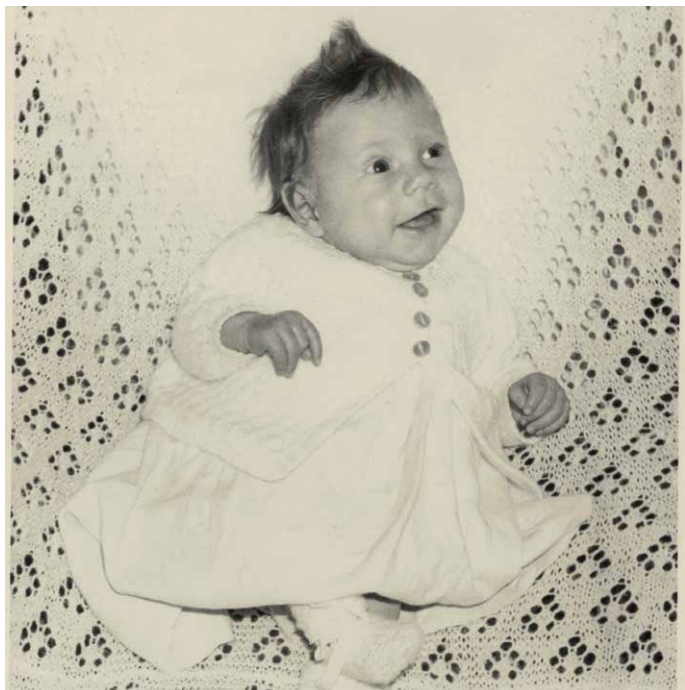

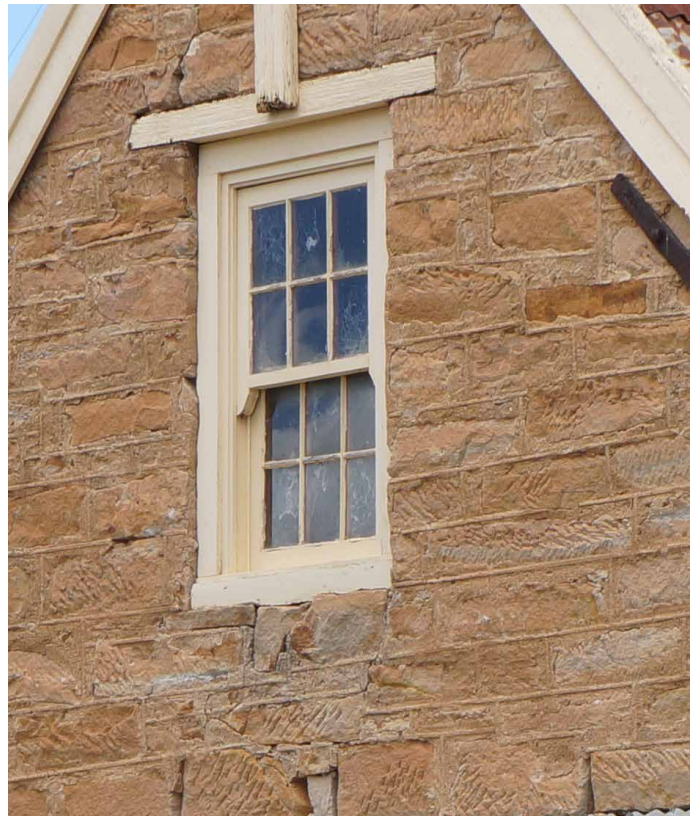
Guess where this is in Marulan

Heritage and Sustainable Parklands Project (HASP)

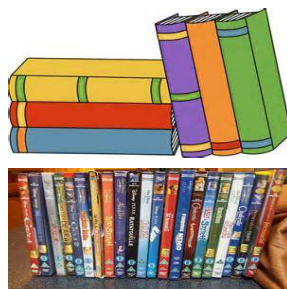

Marulan Progress Association Meridian Arch

Members have now returned from the Christmas break and are now busy working on their next big project of completing the Mosaic in the Meridian Arch. Since sculptor Sebastian Meijbaum has passed the Association has been working with his family to have his vision for the arch finished.

The total cost of the project is \$12,600 which has been paid for with a grant of \$2,200 from Holcim, \$6,000 from the Marulan Progress Association and the remainder, a donation from Sebastian's family.

The Progress Association has commissioned a South Coast company to build the fibreglass dome which has now been done. This is now in the hands of the artist to have the mosaic put over it. However, the sculptor, Suzie Bleach has been diagnosed with Cancer and is now undergoing chemotherapy treatment. Our prayers and well wishes are with her during this time.

Suzie is also finding it difficult to obtain the old fashioned small ceramic tiles as most tiles these days are about a foot square so if you are having a bathroom upgrade or know of a building site which may have some of the old small tiles, please let the Progress Association know.

The Progress Association was hoping to officially unveil the mosaic on the 21st March on the Autumn Equinox, however due to circumstances, they are aiming for the Winter Solstice on 21st June, all being well.

Tony Onions Park Upgrade

The Association together with all the other community organisations is part of the committee to liaise with Holcim and Goulburn Mulwaree Council to improve the facilities in Tony Onions Park. The Story of Charlie Futtachong

At the beginning of this year, I was given a calendar put out by Mick and Joe's Tyre Service. On it was a photograph of Charlie Futtachong, an old Indian Hawker who travelled the Southern Tablelands area in the early 1930's. This was the time of the Great Depression.

My Parents and grandparents lived at Greenwich Park and the old Indian called regularly at our homes selling all kinds of goods. Lots of swagmen and hawkers travelled the roads trying to find work and/or handouts of food.

Now, I was about 5 or 6, little and fat with black hair, cut with a fringe and was a favourite of Futtachong who was probably reminded of the little Indian girls of his homeland. He always gave a small gift before he left each time. This tended to infuriate my sisters and cousins, they nicknamed me "Futtachong" and then it got shortened to "FUT". I was just then very innocent and never made any rude connections.

I still have a cake of soap which was given to me by Futtachong and is now 80 years old. It was made for the coronation of King George V, the grandfather of the present Queen and I treasure it, but it is very worn now a days. I have donated this item to the Marulan & District Historical Society's archives.

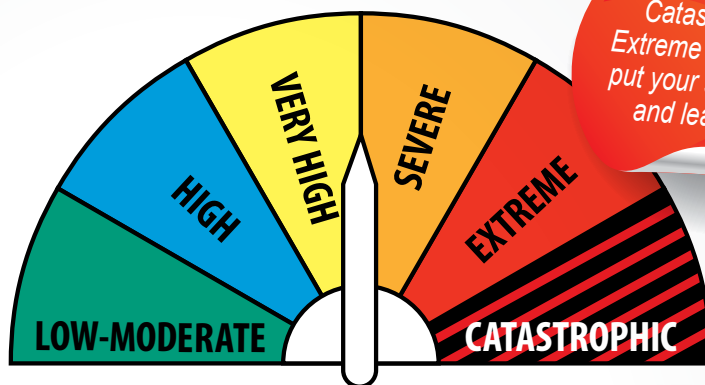


Fire Danger Ratings

WHAT DO THEY MEAN FOR YOU?

Knowing what they mean could save your life

- ☐ If you live or travel through an area where a bush fire can start you need to know what the Fire Danger Rating is and what it means so you can make the safest decision.
- ☐ The Fire Danger Rating is the indication of the consequences of a bush fire if a bush fire was to start.
- ☐ The higher the Fire Danger Rating the more dangerous the conditions and the more likely that people will be injured or die if a bush fire occurs.
- ☐ When the Fire Danger Rating is Extreme or Catastrophic for your area, any fires that start will be extremely hard for fire authorities to control. Even a well prepared, well constructed and actively defended home may not survive.
- ☐ If Catastrophic conditions are expected the best option is to leave early the day or hours before a fire threatens.
- ☐ Keep informed - check the Fire Danger Rating for your area at www.rfs.nsw.gov.au
- ☐ PREPARE your Bush Fire Survival Plan today. Know your trigger points and download a plan from www.rfs.nsw.gov.au

SHE'LL BE APPLES! Tallong Past and Present



April is Sydney Royal Easter Show time and during the first half of the twentieth century Tallong was highly successful in the District Fruit Competitions. These competitions took the form of pyramid displays for both apples and pears which were judged not only on fruit quality but also the design of the pyramid faces. A district was defined as 'an area embraced within 25 miles of any centre' and provided an opportunity for growers who did not compete individually to contribute to a district's promotion. From 1917 until 1949 (when competition classes for apples and pears were removed from the Royal Easter Show), village producers under the banner of the 'Tallong Fruit Growers' Association' were highly successful.

April 2017, however has witnessed the cry and the spectacle of "the Big Apple is up". Many Tallongites stopped to see the Big Apple placed in its permanent structure, uttering the cry and taking photos that have been sent all over the State as Apple Day Festival preparations gather momentum. In pride of place at this year's festival is the Big Apple at the entrance to the Jim Watling Walk in Memorial Park.

This year's 12th Apple Day Festival in Tallong is on Sunday 7th May from 9.00 am to 3.00 pm. There are several new exciting features added and probably the most original is an event known as the Historical Medieval Battles! This is an attraction that started about six years ago in Russia where they wanted not only to recreate battles using medieval armour and weapons but to show them off in real time. Naturally, there are strict rules to ensure the fighting is safe and the organisers believe that with their real, but blunted, weapons and armour it is safer than most sport and a lot more fun!

Also, new this year there will be a snake and reptiles display and whip cracking demonstrations – these too will be safe!

In keeping with Tallong's well-known apple heritage which was interrupted by the catastrophic 1965 bush fires that destroyed more than 250,000 hectares and most of the apple and pear orchards in the district, there will be a display in the Memorial Hall that features the last local Orchard maintained by the late Jim Watling and the current development of the property. The new owners of the Orchard, Bel and Magnus, are putting together a collection of photos and stories about how they have restored the original homestead and apple shed.

There will be all the usual attractions and events: Mrs T's Bake-off to be judged by the Canberra Hyatt's Executive Chef who will also give a cooking demonstration, wood chopping, archery, a vintage car show, internal combustion engine demonstrations and display, the apple-pie eating competition, the creative writing, illustration, and photographic competitions.

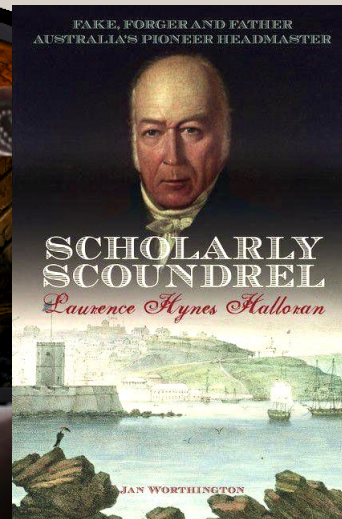
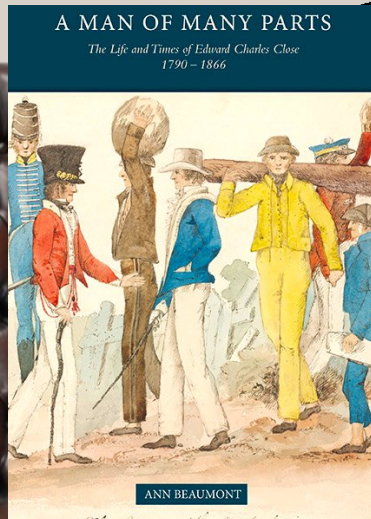

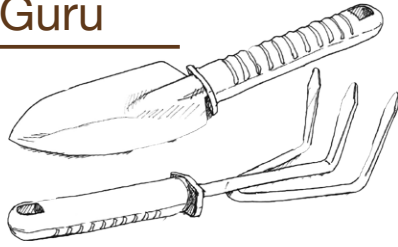

The Garden Guru



April is usually a pleasant month to be out in the garden.

The leaves on the deciduous trees are turning lovely shades of red, orange or yellow.



Now is the time to visit nurseries to look at and pick out trees for planting. While you are there, check the height and width it will grow to allow for it to grow to its full potential.

It is also time for planting Camellia, Azalea, Hibiscus, Daphne and Citrus.

Put in broad bean seed this month to give them a start before the colder weather.

Keep your gardens weeded. Hand weed around newly planted bulbs. Cultivate lightly between vegetable rows to keep down annual weeds. Protect seedlings, bulbs and shrubs from snails and slugs with bait. Caterpillars will still be busy so vegetables such as cabbages should be dusted with derris dust. Remove and squash any caterpillars you notice.

Rake up fallen leaves and use them as mulch around acid loving plants such as Azaleas and Camellias and any natives. They can also be put into the compost heap. Rake them into a corner and put a little soil over them to stop them blowing away.

The Creative Cook



Stuffed Capsicums

Not suggesting that you can only use capsicums that are substandard, “buggered” or “stuffed” in that sense; but rather, ones that have been filled with tasty goodness. You don’t have to use capsicums – many other veggies can be “stuffed”. Here’s a recipe to get you going on your stuffing adventures. These ingredients make enough for six.

Ingredients:

- 2/3 kilograms beef mince
- 110 grams sausage mince (lean, mild or spicy)
- 6 capsicums (medium, or 3 large)
- 385 grams pasta sauce
- 2 teaspoons Italian seasoning
- 3/4 teaspoons garlic powder (or 1 garlic clove, pressed)
- 1/2 red or white onion (diced)
- salt, pepper
- 3 tablespoons grated parmesan cheese
- 300g mozzarella (shredded)

Directions:

Pre-heat oven to 250 degrees. Spray a baking pan with cooking spray. Wash the capsicums, and cut off top quarter. Save or freeze the tops for another use. Remove the seeds and place capsicums on the pan.

Cook the beef mince, sausage mince and onion in a large non-stick pan over medium-high heat. When the meat is almost cooked through, add the sauce and seasoning. Stir and continue to cook until the meat is completely cooked. Add the parmesan cheese.

Add about 1/2 cup of meat mixture to each capsicum. Sprinkle tops evenly with the shredded cheese.

Bake for 20-30 minutes, or until cheese is melted, and lightly golden brown

Boral's Marulan South Operations are pleased to present our regular newsletter for the information of our valued neighbours and wider community.

Diversity

March sees the celebration of International Women's Day and what women can achieve in the community. Boral values Diversity, including women in the workplace. Diversity is about having a wide variety of skills, abilities, experiences and cultural backgrounds in the workplace allowing for a diversity of thinking and ideas to achieve great results and Boral is taking steps to encourage even greater diversity within our workplaces.

Boral has established a Diversity and Inclusion Council with the mission of: "Building an inclusive culture that delivers superior business performance, and is embedded in the way we work".

Cameron Maderia, who previously worked at Peppertree is now a Council member, developing programs across the company to increase diversity.

This can be as simple as flexible working arrangements, indigenous employee programs, buddying programs with more experienced employees or women in quarrying scholarships and partnerships.

A focus for the Quarry business in Boral is to promote and encourage more women into the quarrying.

Of course, when you think of quarrying, it's all about big machines, rocks and engineering, not usually the place where you find women.

But both the Boral quarries here in Marulan, employ a number of women in diverse roles.

We have female operators who can run a crushing plant and load trains as well as machine and truck drivers hauling rock in the Marulan South Limestone pit.

A number of our contractors also employ women in these roles.

To encourage younger women to enter the quarrying business, in 2016 Boral partnered with the University of NSW in offering the "Boral Women in Engineering" Scholarship.

This scholarship aimed to encourage and assist a female student to undertake a degree in either Civil or Chemical Engineering.

The 2016 scholarship was awarded to Petra Quartullo who has commenced her undergraduate study this year into Civil Engineering.

Petra visited a number of the Boral quarry sites including Peppertree earlier in March.

Petra will spend some time each year working in the quarrying businesses as she completes her degree.



The Boral Quarries business also has a graduate program in place whereby graduates spend time at a number of sites to gain experience. For 2017, Peppertree will host a female graduate from Queensland, who will gain skills in managing the daily pit operations, blast protocols and quality control of finished quarry products.

Outward Bound

The 2017 Boral Leadership Outward Bound Program was held over a week in February with 16 students from Goulburn, Mulwaree and Bowral High Schools attending and gaining valuable leadership and personal development skills.

Heart Problems and Our Older Pets

It is very important that, as our pets get older, they have a complete and thorough annual veterinary examination. In fact, we recommend and believe that it is the best standard of care for your pet, especially if they are over 8 years of age, that they receive an examination every 6 months.

At this examination it may be possible to prevent potential problems rather than just trying to treat once the condition is impacting negatively on the animals' quality of life.

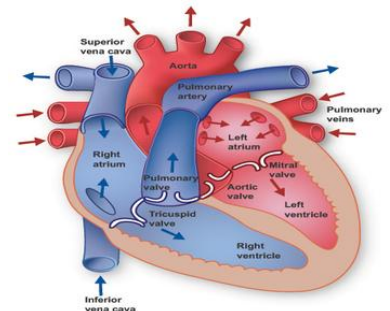


An important part of every veterinary examination performed on your pet is the "cardiac assessment". During this examination a stethoscope is used to listen to the heart....it is determined whether the heart rate and rhythm is normal and whether there are any other noises present such as heart murmurs during the examination. The lungs are also assessed at this time.

There are a number of potential heart conditions that may be present from birth in cats and dogs, but there are a greater number which can develop as your pet becomes older.

The signs exhibited by animals that may be beginning to have problems with their heart include: lethargy, exercise intolerance or reluctance to walk, run or play, increased panting, coughing (particularly at night), inappetence, weight loss, fainting, a build-up of fluid in the abdomen and a change in gum colour from pink to pale pink or a bluish tinge because of impaired blood flow.

There are a number of possible diagnostic and treatment options available for your pet if one of our veterinarians thinks this is necessary. So if you have any concerns about whether your pet may be showing any of these signs please contact us to make an appointment for a cardiac assessment.



There are many other conditions that occur more frequently in our older pets and many of these may be diagnosed with blood tests. At **Marulan Veterinary Hospital** we thoroughly recommend that your older pet has a blood test every 6 months so that we can more thoroughly monitor their health and become aware of potential problems earlier. The prevention and treatment options that are available are generally much more successful when started early on in the course of many conditions.

The Travelling Gourmet



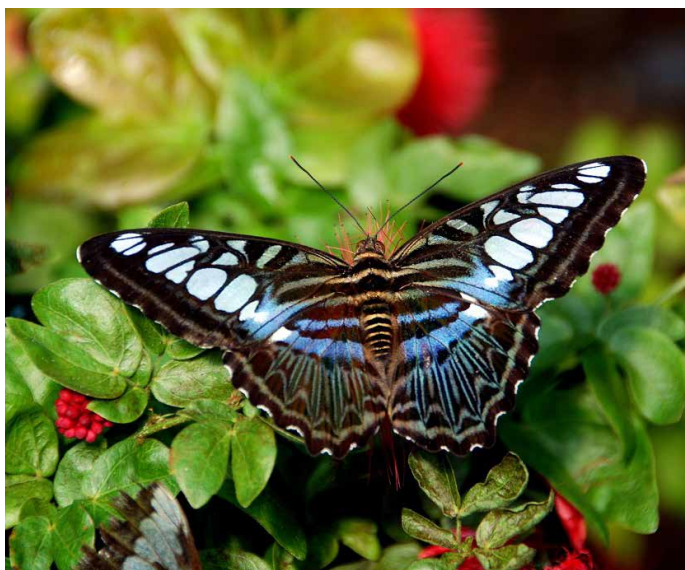
We are awakened by the call to pray from the Mosque across the valley. Out the window we overlook the golf course, early players are out with an entourage of caddies and helpers to fill divot holes and clear leaves and debris for the spoilt golfers of the Cameron highlands.

A mist raises over the valley and the call to pray echoes across its width. Breakfast is again in English tradition, porridge, bacon, eggs, sausages, muffins and of course because of its situation, the best of tea's. The Smokehouse Hotel prides itself on its britishness.

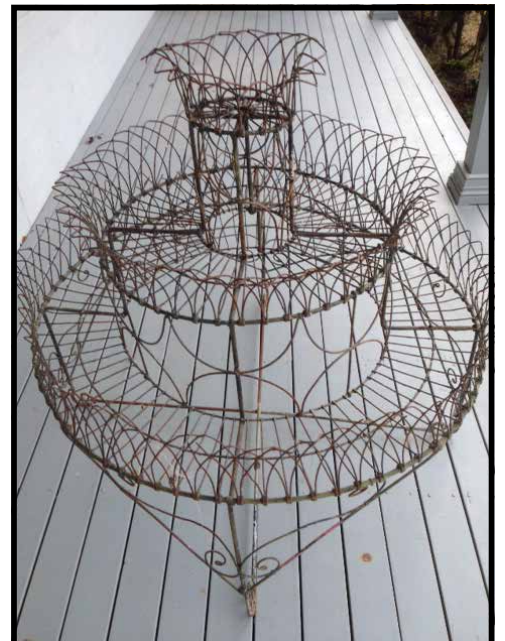
